Qui est là ?

Prompt Machine / Stable diffusion // 2024

The “Qui est là ?” installation is an image-prompting machine.

Visitors stand in front of the machine and type in their “prompt”. An image is generated in real time based on the prompt typed, and appears on the prompter's screen.

The machine's keyboard resembles that of a typewriter, but some of the keys are quite unusual, notably the “Qui est là” key. This “Qui est là” key is surely a key specific to telegraphic exchanges requiring a human operator at each end of the communication, to write and to read messages.

In the light of our times, the “Qui est là” key on the keyboard could only be a key to call out to an A.I., an artificial intelligence that is both vaporous and spiritual, omnipresent. A bit like “Esprit es-tu là?”

The images are created in real time by an A.I. generative image-creation program that transforms a text - prompt - into an image. Image generation tool: Stable Diffusion V1.6




Our digital lives are leaving more and more traces of our activity. Each moment spent online is guided not only by information on websites but also by search engines, and each search leaves a small invisible trace on the Internet, like a useless gesture.

Day after day, we repeat this practice: the same gestures, the same reflexes, the same habits. These repetitions create the invisible tracks of each individual's online itinerary. So we ask ourselves: Since the beginning of the Internet, how much time have we spent in front of the glowing screen? How many times have we loaded Google's homepage? And on this page, left virtually unchanged for years, how many searches have we done? All those swallowed bytes are difficult to qualify on a human scale. Yet some online players, such as Google, very quickly understood the value of each one's personal itinerary. And that the sum total of searches using their engine says just as much about all of us as about each one of us.

In 2006, Google launched the Web Search History function and began saving users' search criteria. Since that very first day, Albertine Meunier has been scrupulously compiling her Google searches and publishing them online. More than eighteen years later, Albertine's successive searches tell a story—not just her own, but also the story of the Web.

In 2024, her "My Google Search History" artwork has entered New Media collection of Centre Pompidou Paris.

And if "after" Earth, there was the Moon and Mars!

And if in our next steps, the Earth had no longer a single no-network area, where even in the most remote and desert areas, our steps could not be done without an omnipresent Internet network!

And if in the world "after" we were prisoners and held by a wire to the paw, infinite and permanent; Thread of our addiction on the big players in the global Internet network, actors of power to have our lives in the big organized data collection, but also to have the sky and "outer" space by flooding it to a frantic pace of thousands of flying objects, light communication satellites.

In contrast to the extremely limited displacement of a large number of humans on Earth during the period of global confinement in March and April 2020, while we were very isolated in our confined spaces, the company Space X (*) of the entrepreneur Elon Musk did not stopped his work of colonization of the sky. Outer space, the object of the common good par excellence, is authoritatively distorted and preempted by private interests.

Intended to create a broadband internet network by putting at least 12000 light satellites into orbit, the Starlink program undeniably produces visible and manifest light pollution by simple observation of the sky. Satellites pass through the sky like shooting stars in a train of light.

Fascinating and poetic, these images are however the testimony of this enterprise of colonization taking place quite simply above our head.


"Dad Won't Come Back" (**) is an online and an in situ installation highlighting this hijacking business by one man, Elon Musk.



Artificial intelligence is invading our daily lives little by little, without us even noticing. We reassure ourselves that never, ever will “machines” achieve the essence of what makes women and men, they will never achieve consciousness, emotion or the act of creation.

When it comes to creating, we all like to think that only human beings are capable of creating, of “making art” in various forms; that this uniquely creative gesture could never be taken away from us by a “machine”.

Currently, a “machine” is incapable of “creating” anything without first being fed data in order to learn the task that we want it to do, in this case, draw a picture. Millions of data—drawings produced by humans—are therefore necessary to perform this machine learning.

In 2017, Google launched the website Quick and Draw—so that millions of people, unbeknownst to them, could produce millions of drawings of a bicycle, cat, dog, umbrella, Mona Lisa, bus, pig... to feed into a Machine Learning program.

Once the data—drawings—are harvested, developers can then rework and use these millions of free drawings to “feed” the Machine Learning program, which in this case, will create drawings on the fly. One of these programs, “Draw Together with a Neural Network” is available for testing online. You choose the object that you want the machine-program to draw, you start drawing the picture, and the machine-program continues.

For A.I Patatras! Albertine saved drawings produced for a bird, paintbrush, bus, pig, skull, rain, pink flamingo, angel and garden. Each picture was initiated from a circle drawn by Albertine.



One century later, a new art movement is created: DataDada.




